

<u>A dependence on</u> volunteers




- 72% on average are volunteers
- Volunteer contribution vital, these include patients, specialists and doctors



Unique counseling function




- First core activity of patient groups
- Relieves the psychological burden
- Provide a contact point for sufferers of a muchstigmatised disease



Awareness-raising



- Up to 90% of infected people not aware of their condition
- Target general public, specific risk groups and healthcare professionals



Engaging stakeholders



- Contact with policy-makers to drive sustainable improvement
- Problems attracting celebrities because of perceived stigma
- Support from specialists but problem remains of attracting attention of general practitioners

Evaluation



- Counseling function has been a success and could be expanded if there were greater resources
- Awareness-raising success difficult to measure
- Availability of treatment not an issue in most MS
- Waiting times for treatment also greatly reduced
- But problems remain in certain Member States, as regards the provision of primary treatment

Evaluation



- <u>Screening</u> is the biggest concern of patient groups no government has made sustainable efforts to improve this, except France and Scotland
- But Croatia and UK have adopted or nearly adopted liver strategies





1. Stigmatization of the disease

2. Health professionals are not interested and have no incentives to do so





- Patient groups doing fantastic job in difficult circumstances – e.g. funding problems and lack of interest from media and health professionals
- Patient groups only body to provide fellow patients with psychological support
- Need a comprehensive strategy which is supported by governments and public health authorities – EU is a natural ally
